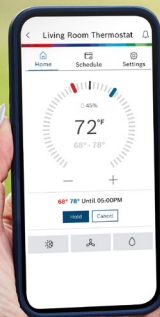

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Meet the Bosch Connected Control (BCC110 Thermostat)

The Bosch Connected Control BCC110 Thermostat is compatible with the majority of 24V heating and cooling equipment to help you save energy and money. Easily control your home's temperature from the full color 5" touchscreen display, the Bosch EasyAir app or your voice with the Bosch Connected Control Alexa Smart Home Skill and your Alexa-enabled smart devices or with Google Assistant.

Compatibility

- ▶ A C-wire (common wire) is required to power the unit. Two wire systems are not supported. If a C-wire is not readily available, we recommend you seek professional support from your local contractor.
- ▶ The Bosch Connected Control BCC110 Wi-Fi Thermostat works with most 24V systems, including gas, oil, propane, electric, forced air, variable speed, heat pump and radiant.
- ▶ For conventional (gas/oil/electric): Heat Only, Cool Only, and Combined Heat & Cool. For heat-pump systems: Up To 4-Heat & 2-Cool. The BCC110 is not compatible with other Bosch Boiler controls, such as the Logamatic.

The thermostat cannot support

- ▶ Line voltage thermostats
- ▶ Electric baseboard heaters
- ▶ Proprietary communicating thermostats
- ▶ Millivolt systems
- ▶ Remote sensors

Professional installation is recommended for the following systems

- ▶ Dual Fuel systems (Heat Pump combined with a Furnace)
- ▶ Whole-home humidifiers and dehumidifiers

- ▶ Pen or Pencil (for preventing wires from falling into the wall)

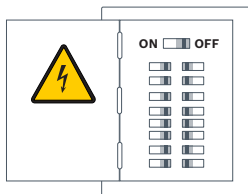
Once you have everything you need, let's get started!

Thermostat Installation

Step 1

Turn OFF power

Turn off all power to your HVAC (Heating, Ventilation, and Air Conditioning) system by using the master equipment switch or circuit breaker box.



WARNING: Failure to turn off the power may result in electrical shock and/or damage to the equipment.

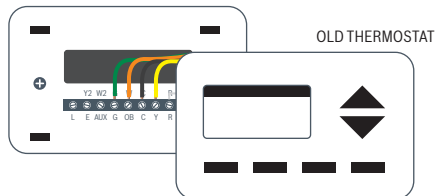
Confirm that your system is off

One way to do this is to try to adjust the temperature on your old thermostat. If you don't hear the system turn on within 5 minutes, air does not come out from the vents or the old thermostat does not even power on, then you have successfully turned off the power to your system.

Step 2

Remove the old thermostat from the old wall plate

OLD WALL PLATE

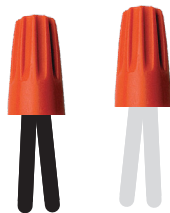


Step 3

Make sure your old thermostat

Does Not Contain Line Voltage Wiring

If you see any of these wire nuts, unfortunately the BCC110 may not work with your system. If you are unsure or would like to discuss your options, please contact a professional or our support line: 1-800-283-3787.



Step 4

Take a picture of the existing wiring

Make sure that you can clearly read the terminal labels and see which wires are connected to which terminals from your photo. You will need to reference this photo later during the initial setup.

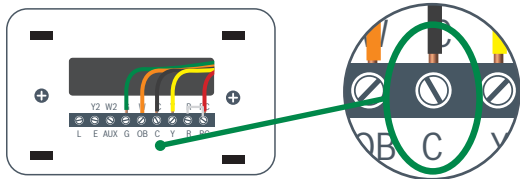
Note: You can also use the wire labels we have provided you to correctly label each wire based on the terminal where it is connected.



Step 5

Confirm you have a C-wire connected to your old thermostat wall plate

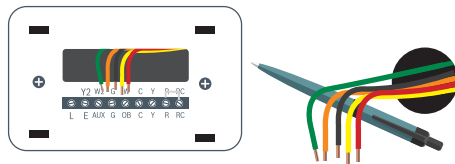
If you do not have a C-wire connected to your old thermostat, please contact a professional or our support line for further assistance to determine if the BCC110 Thermostat is compatible with your system.



Step 6

Disconnect the wires from the old thermostat and remove the wall plate using a screwdriver

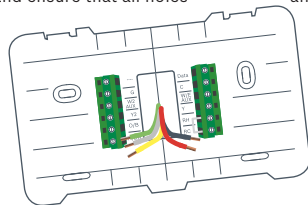
Some thermostats will also require you to use a screwdriver to disconnect the wires. After the wires are disconnected and the wall plate removed, we recommend wrapping a pen or pencil around the wires to prevent them from falling back into the wall.



Step 7

Pull thermostat wires through the hole in the center of the BCC110 wall plate and mark the location of the mounting screws

It is recommended to use the BCC110 Wall Plate as a reference guide to mark the mounting holes and ensure that all holes and unpainted surfaces are covered.

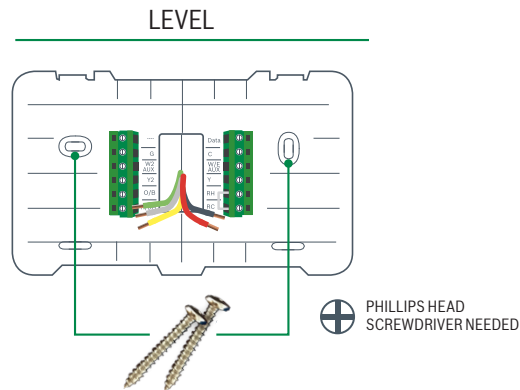
Step 8

Drill and insert wall anchors (if necessary)

Drill two 7/32" holes where you marked the location of the mounting screws and then insert the wall anchors provided into these mounting holes.

Check if the wall plate is level and insert screws

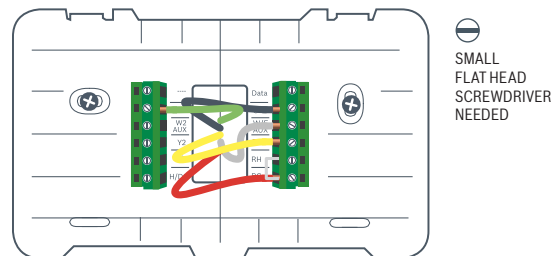
Make sure your new BCC110 wall plate is level and insert the included screws from the package. Mount your new wall plate to the wall using a Phillips head screw driver.



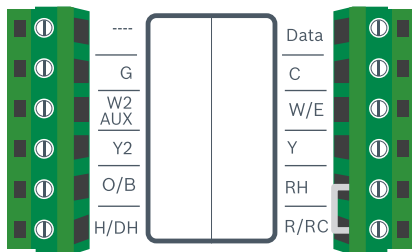
Step 9

Insert each wire into the corresponding terminal and close each terminal using a flat head screw driver

Use the image you took with your smartphone of your old thermostat wiring or the wire labels as a reference for where to place each wire. Be sure that you insert each wire, one by one, and then immediately close the terminal and confirm that the wire is secure inside the terminal before moving to the next wire. Repeat this process for each wire to be installed. If you are unsure of the terminal names on the BCC110 Wall Plate, refer to BCC110 Terminal Key on the next page.

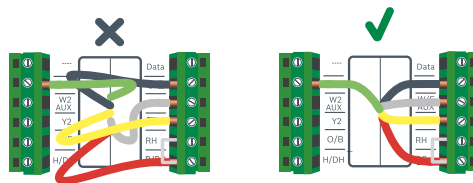

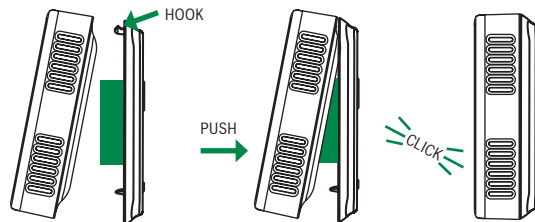
Step 10

After all wires are securely connected, gently push any excess wires back into the hole in the wall



Step 11

Attach the BCC110 thermostat to the BCC110 wall plate

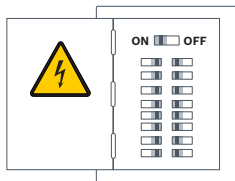

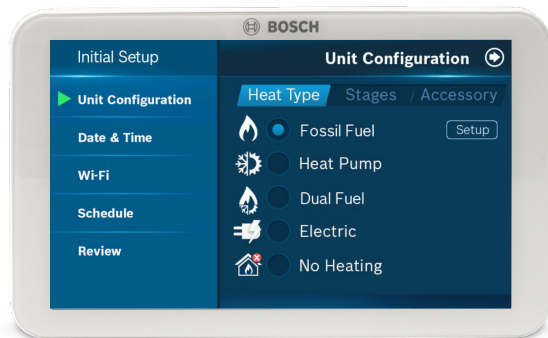
Step 12

Turn ON the power to your HVAC by using the master equipment switch or circuit breaker box

The thermostat will power on and display a Bosch logo and loading bar.



Note: After loading completes, the thermostat will display the following screen:



Step 13

Great job, the hard part's over!

Next, get your smartphone and visit your app store. Download the Bosch EasyAir app to setup your new BCC110

Your BCC110 Thermostat is not yet configured to your home's HVAC system. Go to the Apple App Store or Google Play Store to download the app, create an account, and finish configuring your system.

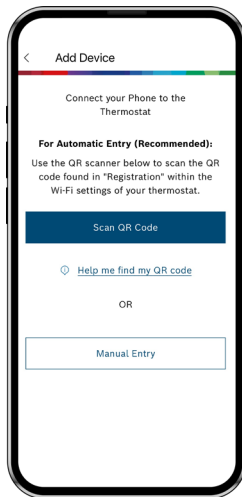
Initial Setup

User Account Setup

1. After downloading the Bosch EasyAir App, open the app on your smartphone and accept the terms and conditions
2. Enter an e-mail address and password with which you would like to register.
3. To begin creating your profile, select your role as "Homeowner".
4. Input your first and last name.
5. Verify phone number by entering the phone verification code you receive via text.
6. Your profile has been successfully created.

Add Device

1. After successfully creating your profile, choose the Appliance you would like to add, in this case BCC110.
2. Return to your thermostat and click Ok to initiate the Initial Setup.
3. Follow the on-screen instructions to name your thermostat and connect your smartphone to the device.
4. Follow the on-screen instructions to name your thermostat and connect your smartphone to the device.



MAC ID and Temporary Verification Code

You can find the MAC ID and Temporary Verification Code by navigating to the Wi-Fi Settings screen on your thermostat and clicking the Registration button.

Initial Setup

For a quick and easy way to begin using your new smart thermostat, the device will automatically direct you to the Initial Setup screen after you have turned it on for the first time.

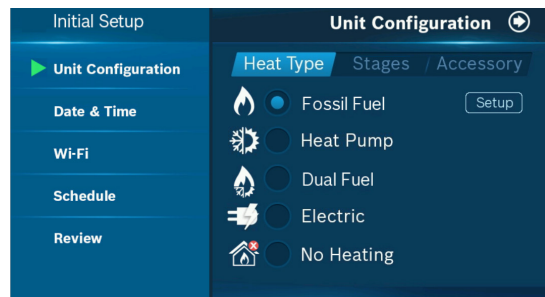
Unit Configuration

Select your home's heating type, stage configuration for heating and cooling, and type of accessory (humidifier or dehumidifier) if available.

Select your heat type

Select your Heat Type according to the heating appliance located in your home. Below is a list of helpful tips that may guide you to selecting the correct option for your home.

Note: If you are unsure of which option to select, contact your local contractor or our support line: 1-800-283-3787.



If you have a furnace

1. Select Fossil Fuel and click the Next Arrow at the top right corner of the screen.
2. Then select Appliance or Thermostat depending on your personal preferences for fan control.
3. Click Next Arrow at the top right corner of the screen.

If you have a boiler

1. Select Fossil Fuel and click the Next Arrow at the top right corner of the screen.
2. Then select Appliance
3. Click Next Arrow at the top right corner of the screen.

If you have a heat pump

1. Select Heat Pump and click the Next Arrow at the top right corner of the screen.
2. Then follow the on-screen instructions.
3. Click Next Arrow at the top right corner of the screen.
4. Configure the reversing valve for O (energized in cool) or B (energized in heat) and enable/disable Emergency Heat and/or Auxiliary Heat.

If you have a dual fuel system

1. Select Dual Fuel and click the Next Arrow at the top right corner of the screen.
2. Then follow the on-screen instructions to configure the fossil fuel fan control settings
3. Click Next Arrow at the top right corner of the screen. Then follow the on-screen instructions to configure the heat pump dual fuel changeover settings.

4. Use the Balance Point to set the outdoor temperature value the thermostat will use to switch between your heat pump and fossil fuel appliance. Above this value, your thermostat will use your heat pump to heat your home and below this value, your thermostat will use your fossil fuel heating appliance.
5. Use the Change over Delay to set the time the system will be off when changing between heat pump and fossil fuel heating sources. This delay allows for the coil to cool before switching between heating appliances.

Note: In a dual fuel system, the BCC110 automatically enables auxiliary heating using the fossil fuel heating appliance.

Note: In a dual fuel system, the BCC110 will stage up from heat pump to fossil fuel following the stage settings, which can be modified in Advanced Settings > Installer Access > by using the ST Action Code.

6. Click Next Arrow at the top right corner of the screen.

If you have an electric system

Select Electric and click Next Arrow at the top right corner of the screen

If you have no heating appliance

Select No Heating and click Next Arrow at the top right corner of the screen

Select your stage configuration

Select your stage configuration according to the heating and cooling appliances you have in your home and then click Next Arrow at the top right corner of the screen.

Need Help?

If you are unsure of which option to select, contact your local contractor or our support line: 1-800-283-3787.

If you have a whole home humidifier or dehumidifier accessory wired to your thermostat, select the type of accessory you have in your home; otherwise, click None and then click Next Arrow.

Note: Professional installation is recommended for humidifiers and dehumidifiers.

If you have a Humidifier

1. Select Humidifier and click the Next Arrow at the top right corner of the screen.
2. Then select Evaporative or Steam following the on-screen instructions. For Evaporative the humidifier is activated only during active heating. For Steam the humidifier is activated regardless of a heating call.
3. Click Next Arrow at the top right corner of the screen.

If you have a Dehumidifier

1. Select Dehumidifier and click the Next Arrow at the top right corner of the screen.
2. Then enable or disable Cool to Dehumidify following the on-screen instructions. If Cool to Dehumidify is enabled the dehumidifier is activated only during active cooling. If disabled the dehumidifier is activated regardless of a cooling call.
3. Click Next Arrow at the top right corner of the screen.

Initial Setup

Date & Time

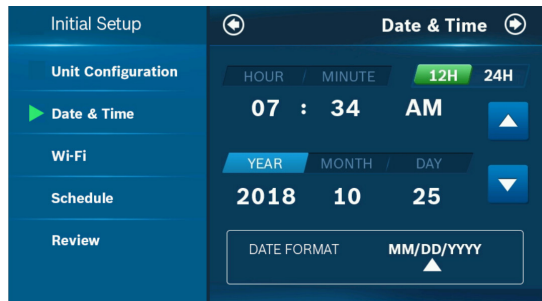
Follow the on-screen instructions to set the date and time of BCC110 Thermostat and then click Next Arrow at the top right corner of the screen.

On Device

Enter your location's current date and time; after the device is registered or linked to a user account, the date and time on the device will automatically update to the current time associated with the user account.

APP

The date and time for the device, as well as the user account, will automatically update by selecting the time zone for the device.

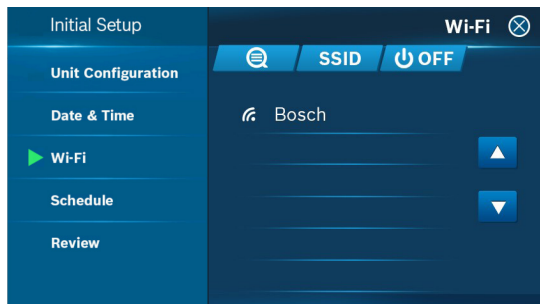


Wi-Fi

The BCC110 requires a reliable Wi-Fi connection in order to access smart features such as remote access, weather forecast and more. To complete the Wi-Fi setup, follow the on-screen instructions.

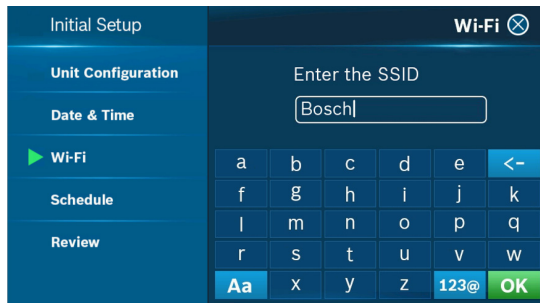
Scan

To start Wi-Fi setup, click the Scan icon to view available Wi-Fi networks. Follow the on-screen instructions to complete the Wi-Fi setup.



Manual Entry

If you are trying to connect to a hidden network, press the SSID button to bring up the SSID screen. Enter your SSID into the text box, then follow the on-screen instruction to complete the Wi-Fi setup.

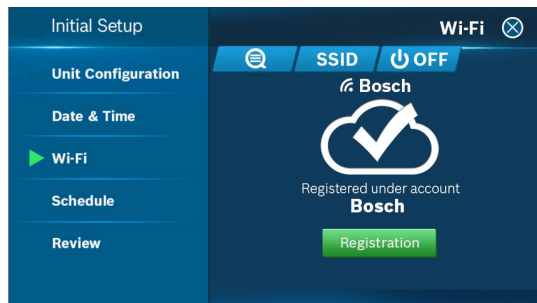


Note: If this is a first time installation, follow the instructions in the App Setup section of this User Guide to register your thermostat to your smart device.

The following may cause a failed connection to the device:

- ▶ Wi-Fi signal is too weak
- ▶ 5 GHz Wi-Fi network is not supported
- ▶ SSID contains space or non-ASCII characters
- ▶ Incorrect password
- ▶ Wi-Fi is okay but your internet is unavailable
- ▶ Additional web authentication is not supported

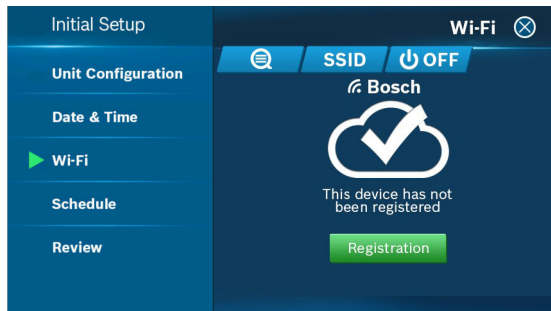
After you have successfully established a connection, your network name appears. If your thermostat is already registered to your account on your smart device, your User ID name appears. Follow additional instructions on the screen to complete setup. After completing the setup, download the Bosch Bosch EasyAir App from the Apple Store or Google Play Store. Create an account within the app and then add a device (BCC110) by following the on-screen instructions.



Note: For all smart devices that require access to the same thermostat, you must use the same account.

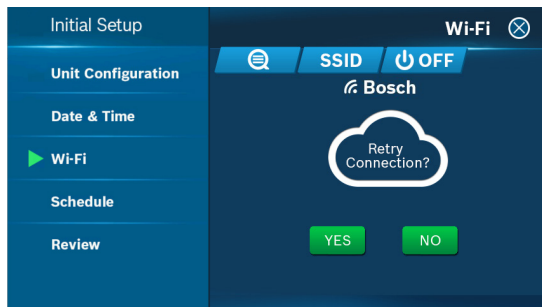
Initial Setup

For an unregistered device, click the green Registration button to register your account. If you want to register a different account to your device, you can also click the Registration button and follow the steps outlined in the App Setup section of this User Guide.



Auto Reconnect

If your device loses connection with your wireless network, it will automatically attempt to reconnect after 5 minutes. If that fails, it will make a new attempt every 15 minutes for the next 24 hours. Any manual network reconfiguration of the thermostat will stop automatic reconnection attempts.



Schedule

Choose the schedule you would like to modify, or select No Schedule if you do not wish to set up a schedule at this time, and click the Setup button or Next arrow.

Note: Home is the default schedule for your BCC110. If you wish to add a different schedule, use the Bosch EasyAir App.

To set up your periods for the day, click on the Start Time bubble of the period and use the Up/Down arrows to set the start time of the first period of the day.

1. Next, click the Heat bubble and use the Up/Down arrows to set the heating setpoint for the first period of the day.
2. Then, click the Cool bubble and use the Up/Down arrows to set the cooling setpoint for the first period of the day.

Note: There is a 5 degree deadband required between heating and cooling setpoints to prevent equipment from short cycling.

3. If you want to add more periods, then click add period button and repeat the above 3 steps until you have set all your periods for the day.

Note: You are allowed a maximum of 8 periods per day.

4. If you want to delete a period, select any bubble corresponding to that period and click Delete.
5. After you have set up one day of the week, use the Copy section to mirror the same daily schedule to other days of the week by clicking on the days you would like to copy that daily set of periods. Then click next.

Note: If you have not copied your schedule to all 7 days of the week, you will be required to repeat the above steps until you have set a schedule for everyday of the week.

On Device

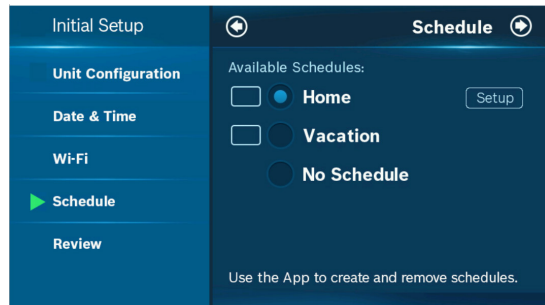
During offline operations, only 2 schedules (Home and Vacation) are available. However, when a Wi-Fi connection is established, the list can be expanded up to 4 schedules.

Home

You can use this schedule to set your heating/cooling equipment to predefined set points. The device initially comes with a factory default schedule, which can be adjusted as necessary.

Vacation

This schedule will be used to set your heating/cooling equipment to 2 periods with set points (1 heating and 1 cooling) that can be manually adjusted. However, you will not be able to add additional or remove current periods. The schedule can be used for vacation or permanently setting a heating/cooling set point.



Initial Setup

Review

In the final step, the BCC110 provides a summary review of information that you have entered into the thermostat. You will be able to go back to different parts of the Initial Setup guide by pressing the different sections on the left pane or using the Previous arrow. If you have completed the review, please press the Complete button to start utilizing your BCC110!

Advanced Settings

Advanced Settings allow HVAC professionals the ability to modify specific thermostat settings for better control of the heating and cooling appliance(s). In order to access the Advanced Settings of the BCC110 Thermostat, your thermostat must be connected to Wi-Fi. The Advanced Settings section is accessible from the Menu of the BCC110 thermostat.

FOR CONTRACTORS ONLY: Advanced Settings are for professional use only and require an access code

ACCESS CODE: 1886

Installer Access

- ▶ To access the Installer Access, click Advanced Settings, enter the Professional Access Code and click Installer
- ▶ Enter any one of the Action Codes in parenthesis below to gain access to that specific setting:

Humidity Calibration (HC): Ability to adjust humidity readings after extended product use.

Relative Humidity Hysteresis (HSD): Adjust the set point differential for the humidity control.

Initial Setup (IS): Initial Setup process.

Sensor Calibration (SC): Ability to adjust temperature readings after extended use.

Sensitivity Level (SS): The lower the level, the more your system cycles to maintain the set point(s).

Staging (ST): Configuration options: Latching, Stage Delay and Stage Temp.

Electric Heat Kit (EHK): Ability to adjust the W hysteresis and EHK stage delay

Advanced Settings

Heating & Cooling

- ▶ To access the Heating and Cooling, select Advanced Settings from the Menu, then select Heating and Cooling.
- ▶ Enter the Professional Access Code and select a parameter to modify the default value. From this menu you can adjust:

Title	Default	Max	Min	Description
Fan Delay On	0 Seconds	120 Seconds	0 Seconds	The fan's lag time after the heating or cooling call is initiated when in Fossil Fuel, Heat Pump, or Cooling operation.
Fan Delay On Elec	0 Seconds	5 Seconds	0 Seconds	The fan's lag time after the heating or cooling call is initiated when in Electric, Auxiliary heat, or Emergency heat operation.
Fan Delay Off	60 Seconds	120 Seconds	30 Seconds	The fan's lag time after the heating or cooling call is terminated.
Min. Run Time	5 Minutes	Stage Delay	3 Minutes	The minimum amount of time a heating or cooling call will run after the initial call. This timer resets and must be met after each stage up condition.
Anti Short Cycle	5 Minutes	5 Minutes	0 Minutes	The minimum amount of time a heating or cooling call will run after a stage down condition. This timer resets and must be met after each stage down condition.
Cycle Time	180 Seconds	300 Seconds	60 Seconds	Time delay required between system mode changes before active heating or cooling calls can begin.
Zero Energy Band Heating	1°F/ 0.5°C	2°F/ 1°C	0.5°F/ 0.3°C	A temperature range between the current temperature and the heating set point, where heating is not engaged.
Zero Energy Band Cooling	1°F/ 0.5°C	2°F/ 1°C	0.5°F/ 0.3°C	A temperature range between the current temperature and the cooling set point, where cooling is not engaged.
Deadband	5°F/3°C	9°F/5°C	2°F/1°C	A temperature range between the heating set point and cooling set point in Auto Mode, where heating/cooling is not engaged.

Troubleshooting & Frequently Asked Questions

Wi-Fi

Can the BCC110 be used without Wi-Fi?

We strongly encourage everyone to use the Wi-Fi capabilities of the thermostat, as it will improve the user experience. However, it is functional without the use of Wi-Fi after the Initial Setup has been completed.

NOTE: The Dual Fuel feature is disabled when Wi-Fi is unavailable. Dual fuel requires Wi-Fi to determine outdoor air temperature and function properly.

Will the BCC110 support all Wi-Fi systems & routers?

This device only works with 2.4 GHz systems and is NOT compatible with 5.0 GHz systems or web pages that require additional web authentication.

Trouble Connecting to your Home's Wi-Fi Network?

1. Make sure that your thermostat is a maximum 20 ft or less from the router/modem without any obstructions (i.e. walls, floors, ceilings, etc.). If obstructions exist, try moving your thermostat and router/modem closer together.
2. Before attempting to reconnect your thermostat to your home network, power cycle your router/modem and then your thermostat. If you have a separate router and modem, make sure that you power cycle the modem first and then the router.
3. In the event that you still cannot connect to your home's wi-fi network please contact our support team for further in-depth technical troubleshooting options.

NOTE: If you are able to connect to your home network, but the time does not update on the thermostat, you are not fully connected to the cloud server. Please follow the troubleshooting steps again or contact Bosch Technical Support.

Troubleshooting & Frequently Asked Questions

Bosch EasyAir App (Android and iOS)

What is the name of the smartphone app in the App Store and Google Play Store?

The name of the app is Bosch EasyAir App.

How many accounts can be associated with the thermostat at once?

Only one account can be associated with a given thermostat. Family members must share their account information with each other if they would like to be able to control the thermostat from multiple devices.

Can this device be accessed via a web page?

Not at this time.

Thermostat

What happens if I lose power to the device; will all my settings be lost?

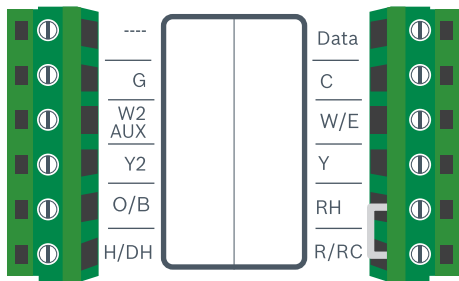
All settings are kept in local memory, except for the schedule setpoints, which are stored in the cloud. Therefore, all settings will be saved even during a power outage.

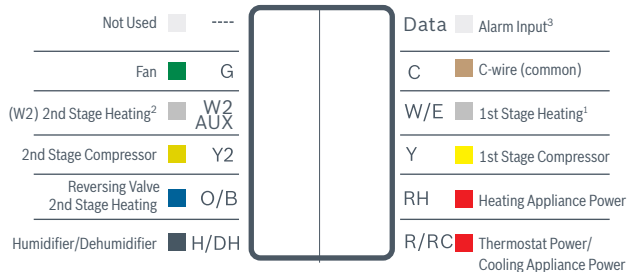

BCC110 Terminal Key

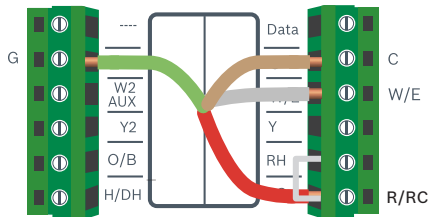

Single Stage Heat – Furnace

Example: Bosch 80% AFUE Gas Furnace - BGS80

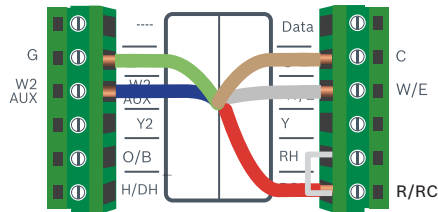
- ▶ Ensure the system has a C-wire
- ▶ Ensure the pre-installed jumper wire remains between RH and RC
- ▶ Connect the R, C, W1 and G wires from the Furnace to R/RC, C, W/E and G terminals on the wall plate, respectively



Two Stage Heat – Furnace

Example: Bosch 96% AFUE Gas Furnace - BGH96

- ▶ Ensure the system has a C-wire
- ▶ Ensure the pre-installed jumper wire remains between RH and R/RC
- ▶ Connect the R, C, W1, W2 and G wires from the Furnace to R/RC, C, W/E, W2/AUX and G terminals on the wall plate, respectively

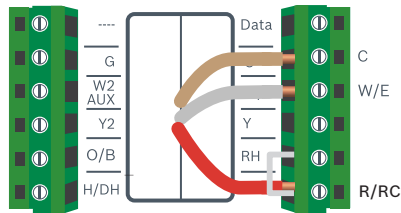


Wiring Diagrams

Single Stage Heat – Boiler

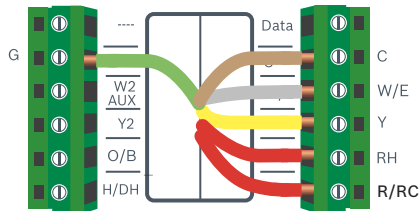
Example: Bosch Greenstar Gas Condensing Boilers*

- ▶ Ensure the system has a C-wire
- ▶ Ensure the pre-installed jumper wire remains between RH and RC
- ▶ Remove the jumper from the thermostat connection on the boiler and connect the two terminals to RH and W/E on the thermostat.
- ▶ ***NOTE:** Bosch Greenstar boilers will require an external transformer to power the thermostat. The two power wire should connect to R/RC and C on the Thermostat.



Combined Single Stage Heat Furnace and Single Stage Cool Air Conditioner

- ▶ Ensure the system has a C-wire
- ▶ Remove the pre-installed jumper wire from between RH and R/RC
- ▶ Connect the R, C, W1 and G wires from the Furnace to RH, C, W/E and G terminals on the wall plate, respectively
- ▶ Connect the R, C, Y1 and G wires from the Air Conditioner to R/RC, C, Y and G terminals on the wall plate, respectively

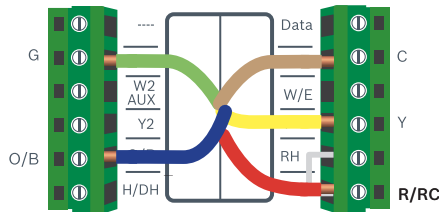
Heat pump systems

Heat pump systems are specialty designed to be able to provide heating and cooling using a single compressor, a reversing valve, and a fan.

Single Stage Heat Pump

Example: Bosch Inverter Ducted Split

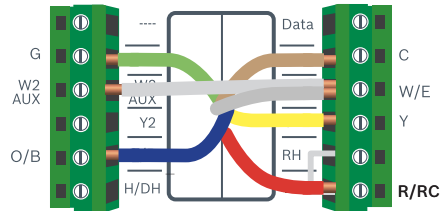
- ▶ Ensure the system has a C-wire
- ▶ Ensure the pre-installed jumper wire remains between RH and R/RC
- ▶ Connect the R, C, Y1, O/B and G wires from the heat pump to R/RC, C, Y, O/B and G terminals on the wall plate, respectively



Single Stage Heat Pump with Emergency Heat and Auxiliary Heat

Note: W/E controls Emergency Heat output, and W2/AUX controls Auxiliary Heat output.

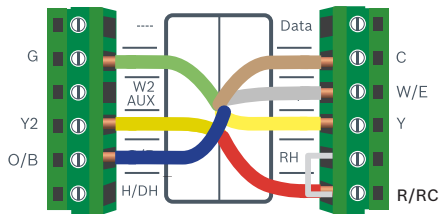
- ▶ Ensure the system has a C-wire
- ▶ Ensure the pre-installed jumper wire remains between RH and R/RC
- ▶ Connect the R, C, W1, Y1, O/B and G wires from the heat pump to R/RC, C, W/E, Y, O/B and G terminals on the wall plate, respectively
- ▶ Connect jumper wire between W/E and W2/AUX.

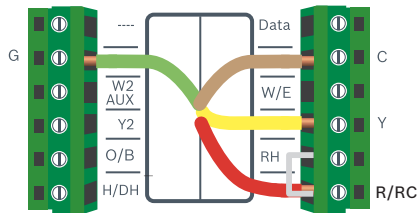

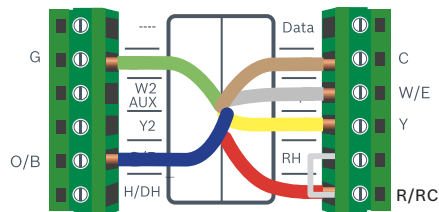

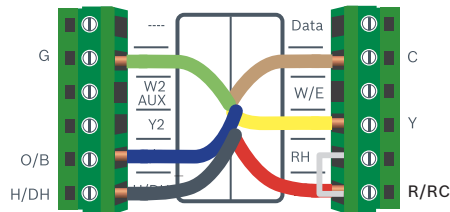


Humidifier or Dehumidifier Accessory with a Single Stage Heat Pump

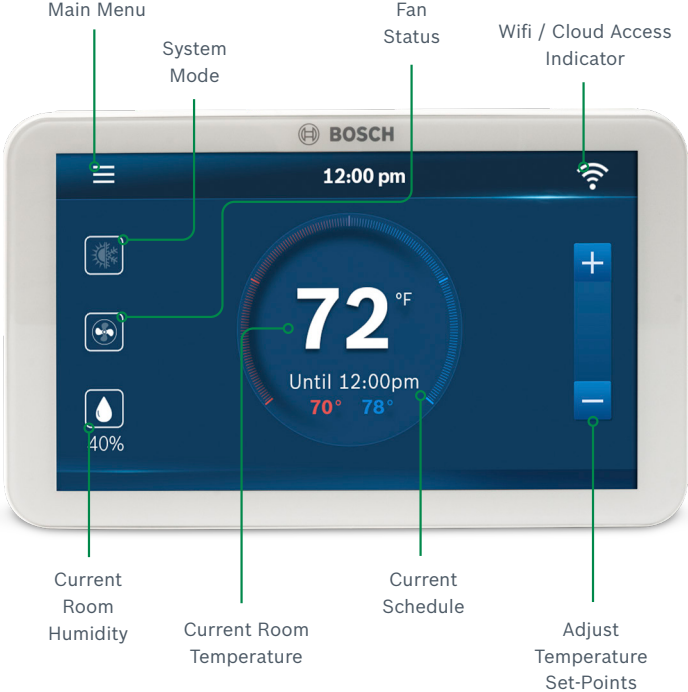

Adjusting Temperature Setpoint(s)

Temporary Adjustment

This feature will override the current set point in favor of the set point you enter until the next programmed time in the schedule. If you would like to permanently schedule the new set point, press the lock icon. This will permanently lock in the adjustment until the X button is pressed on the main screen.

Schedule Override on the Thermostat

You can override the current scheduled set point(s) by tapping the plus or minus (+/-) icons on the right side of the screen.

If you are in Auto mode, manually adjust either the Heat/Cool set points individually by selecting the appropriate bubble, then tapping the plus or minus (+/-) icons. If a Heat/Cool bubble is not selected pressing the (+/-) icons will adjust both setpoints simultaneously.

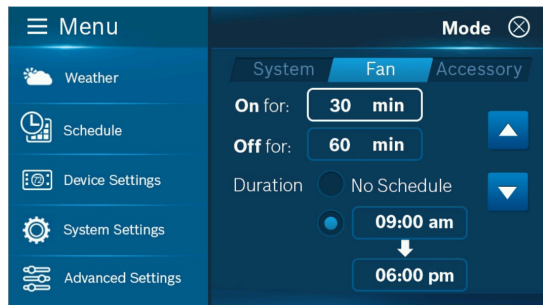
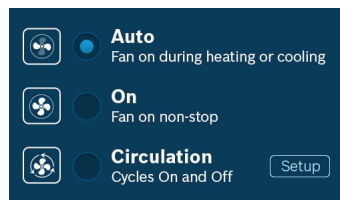

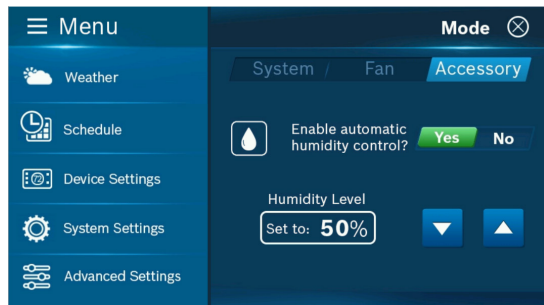

Humidifier & Dehumidifier Operating Mode

You can enable automatic humidity control if the correct humidifier or dehumidifier accessory was correctly wired and configured during the thermostat's initial setup. Based on the setup, the thermostat turns on the humidifier during heating operation and the dehumidifier will be turned on during cooling operation. You can also configure the thermostat to operate similar to a humidistat, which runs the humidifier or dehumidifier, regardless of an active heating/cooling call.

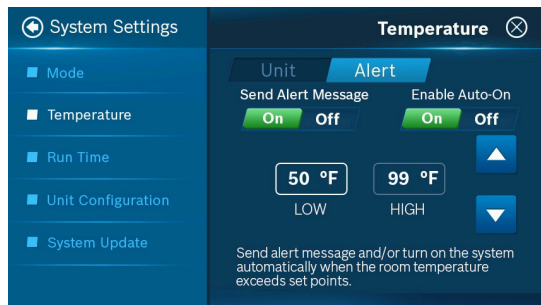
Note: You may only operate in either humidifier OR dehumidifier mode and may not operate in both modes at the same time.



Temperature, Alerts, and Auto-On

Alert: Send an alert message or turn on the system automatically when the room temperature is out of the range between set-points.

Run Time
